Description of site:

Water-filled quarry and spoilheaps from former cement workings. Water very clear and of high quality. Very deep in parts with shallow bays. Extensive aquatic plant growth, increased rapidly in 1980's. Spoilheaps partly grassland with good variety of calcicole plants. Rapid spread of scrub into the grassland areas. Some areas completely covered with Hawthorn or Elder scrub. Some semi-mature woodland, mainly Ash. One area of acid ash/clinker substrate with bracken. One corner of pool has marshy area with Willows. Flat north bank with Sallow.

Features which make site important for conservation:

The clean hard water has an interesting population of aquatic invertebrates and is also an important breeding, wintering and roosting site for birds. The calcareous soil of the spoilbanks supports an excellent range of herbaceous plants typical of the soil type, largely confined in Warks. In 1957 in "The Flora of the Rugby District" D E Allen said that the quarry "probably possesses the richest flora of any area of comparable size in the district." This situation still applies today.

Unusual and important animals and plants present:

In the water: many Crayfish (otherwise uncommon locally) present. Other interesting crustacea also occur. Breeding Great Crested Grebes, Coot, Moorhen, and Mallard. Tufted Duck, Pochard, Shoveller regular visitors. 22 species of butterfly have been recorded and 44 species of spider. 34 species of Hoverfly have also been found, of which 2 are regarded as nationally notable species and 2 as uncommon in Warks. A nationally notable moth has also been recorded. Many other species will undoubtedly be found. Among the notable flowers are Bee and Common Spotted Orchids, Milkwort, Wild Strawberry, Centaury, Wild Mignonette, Wild Parsnip, Wild Carrot, Water Mint, Twayblade, Hoary Plantain, and Quaking Grass. A wide range of commoner species also occur.

Any threats to site:

Following a fatal accident in autumn 1990, proposals have been made to make the quarry safer by a variety of means such as filling the pool in completely, or reducing its depth, and lowering the spoilheaps. Any of these courses would have extremely detrimental effects on the wildlife value of the site.

Management work needed:

The main value of the spoilheaps lies in the grassland flora and associated insects. The Hawthorn scrub is rapidly taking over and this grassland is disappearing. The best parts of the grassland need to be identified and clearance of scrub undertaken.

Comments:

This site is of major conservation importance but is under extreme threat. Even if the threats to change the quarry do not materialise, the present state of neglect means that the value of the site will deteriorate rapidly by natural means unless action is taken. This will involve: a) undertaking a detailed ecological survey of the site b) drawing up a management plan from the survey c) implementing the plan
